Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 22:19-23; Psalm 137; Romans 11:33-36; Matthew 16:13-20 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today's readings speak to us strongly about universal salvation: the hope that every person will be saved. This was a huge controversy at times in the early Church and even today. Many have said: If everyone is going to be saved, why should we do anything? First, we must recognize that there is never anything "automatic" about being saved. Otherwise, there is no need for any salvation! Then what is salvation? Salvation is to be taken out of this situation of sinfulness by a power greater than us. Ultimately, we come to know this power as God and His love at work in our lives in Christ Jesus!

The Prophet Isaiah in today's first reading speaks of God's salvation for all those who honour the name of God, joining themselves to the Lord and becoming His servants. This was a huge breakthrough in the history of understanding God's love for us. Even those who were not "the chosen people" could be saved. This insight continues to be developed even in our own time. What a joy it is to live in a time when we can believe that Hindus, Moslems, Buddhists and all other believers in many systems of "religion" can be saved! We are encouraged to have respect for all such "religious systems" and to particularly respect all who seek truth in any form at all. That does not mean that the teachings of Christ are just one among other religious teachings and Christ is just like any other founders of religions. The CCC (Catechism of the Catholic Church) paragraph 846 clearly affirms this. "All salvation comes from Christ the Head through the Church which is his Body." Even though we can find elements of truth in every religion, Christianity possesses the complete truth because Christ is 'The Truth'.

In the Gospel we see Jesus refusing the appeals of the Canaanite woman at first. The response of Jesus might appear fulfilling at first glance. He seems to dismiss her appeals that his mission is primarily to the lost sheep of Israel. However, she is so humble that he could resist her appeals for the life of her daughter. This woman's faith shines even brighter; she persists in her plea falling at Jesus's feet and begging for help. What happens next reveals a deep lesson about faith and humility. We are challenged to have the faith of this woman who was not "of the chosen people". In our daily lives we meet people at times who seem to have no obvious faith and yet seem to trust more in God than we do! We meet people who have other religious systems and have given their lives over completely to the teachings of those systems, while we are lukewarm in our faith in Christ. This is exactly Jesus' point: 'What great faith we find in others'! The Canaanite woman approach Jesus with the kind of faith that truly pleases him. In doing so we shall certainly experience the transforming power of His grace in our lives and become witnesses to his boundless love in a world that's so desperately needs it. As we go home, let us carry the example of the Canaanite woman in our hearts. Let us be inspired to live out a faith that perseveres, humbles and trusts knowing that our saviour is ever ready to respond to the cries of his beloved children. God Bless us all.
