Next Sunday's Mass Readings Genesis 3:9-15; Psalm 129; 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1; Mark 3:20-35 In simplicity, Jesus gives us the greatest sacrament: the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is the most sober & most solemn Sacrament where we experience communion between God and us. At a young age, the young boy Carlo Acutis knew what truly nourishes and heals us: the Eucharist. As a young boy he used his talents for the Kingdom of God: he created a website on Eucharistic miracles and other religious websites. Bl Carlo Acutis would say, "The more Eucharist we receive, the more we will become like Jesus". The Eucharist has sustained generations and continues to bring healing.

Today, we celebrate the solemn feast of Corpus Christi. It is three feasts in one: the feast of the Eucharistic sacrifice, the feast of the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the feast of the Real Presence of Jesus in this Sacrament. Corpus Christi is a doctrinal feast established for three purposes: 1) to give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist, 2) to instruct us in the Mystery, Faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist, and 3) to teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice. In the Old Testament from time to time we get glimpses and hints of Jesus who is to come, in events or people who are pointing the way to Jesus. In the book of Genesis (Gen 14:18-20) we see the priest Melchizedek is one of those people in the Old Testament giving us a glimpse and hint of Jesus to come. Melchizedek was a priest and Jesus is the High Priest of the New Testament which Psalm 109 prophesied: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek." Melchizedek brought bread and wine which is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist that Jesus would give.

St. Paul's description of the Last Supper, in his first letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 11:23-26) is very precious to us because it is the oldest account of the Last Supper in the Scriptures, written even before the Gospels. Jesus said, "This is my body..." He did not say, "This is a symbol of my body" or "This represents my body" but Jesus said, "This is my body." Transubstantiation is the name we give to the bread and wine changing into the body and blood of Jesus while maintaining the appearance of bread and wine. Trans - substance, the substance is transformed while maintaining its external appearance of bread and wine: transubstantiation. In the Gospel of Luke (Luke 9:11-17) we see the miracle of Jesus feeding thousands from only five loaves and two fish. This miracle is preparing for the greatest New Testament miracle, the Eucharist. Jesus performed the same four actions over the bread and fish, when he multiplied them, as he would do later over the bread during the Last Supper; he took the bread and fish, said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to his disciples. Finally, today in the solemnity of Corpus Christi, what Christ offers us is His Real Body and Blood, real food and real drink which is the core of our faith. In the Holy Eucharist, Christ draws us closer to himself. Christ is present with us in the Holy Eucharist as the head of the Church. So, today's celebration provides us an opportunity to thank and adore Christ, present in the Most Holy Sacrament. So let us adore Christ saying: O Sacrament Most Holy, all praise and all thanksgiving be unto you. Let's remember the quote of Bl Carlo Acutis, "The more Eucharist we receive, the more we will become like Jesus".
