Once the houses are built there will only be 66 spaces for the use of parishoners and hall users. But, during the build, this number will be reduced, inevitably leading to issues. When further details are available, including how the issues will be managed, these will be communicated.

MESSAGE FROM FATHER HUDSON'S CARE-NEW CEO

As we say goodbye to CEO Andy Quinn and wish him all the best in his retirement, we welcome new CEO Joanne Watters who will start her new role on 1st June 2024. Joanne has been working for Father Hudson's Care for the last 9 years as Head of Community Projects, working with partners to develop new and existing projects including Tabor Living which accommodates individuals experiencing homelessness, Brushstrokes Community Project supporting refugees, asylum seekers and migrants, and others, including Young at Heart in north Staffordshire, Sophia House, Fatima House, and the refugee community sponsorship initiative. Joanne has a passion for supporting individuals and families who are marginalised and in need, in 2023 she led, together with Fr Michael White, the successful capital fundraising appeal which enabled the charity to double its homelessness provision working based at St. Catherine of Siena Church in Birmingham.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Ezekiel 17:22-24;

Psalm 91;
2 Corinthians 5:6-10;

Mark 4:26-34

Today the liturgical readings reminds us that as humans, we all have an existential struggle against evil. However, the good news is that, we are assured that the ultimate of victory is with us by the because at the end of the day it is Christ, the seed of the Woman (Mary) who helps us to obtain this victory in our daily and earthly struggle against evil, because He is the one who controls everything.

Today's first reading presents a more anthropomorphic view of God; a God who is presented as having feelings or characteristics like a human being. God is closer to humans; He walks and talks with them. It's a very beautiful image to think of - a deep level of intimacy between God and humans. God seeks out humans, however, the man and woman hide themselves among the trees in the garden when they hear God approaching (Genesis 3:8b). The story of the fall of Adam and Eve reminds us of something that we inherited from them- the Original Sin, the adamic nature due to Original Sin and the consequences of disobedience. instead of admitting their fault, they tried to justify themselves by blaming each other. While Adam indirectly blames God since it was God who had given the woman to him as a companion, Eve blames the serpent for having deceived her into eating the fruit. Interestingly, only the serpent is cursed. None of them said, I am sorry, I was wrong, it was my fault or even, please forgive me. Instead, they found excuses to exonerate themselves and, someone else must take the blame. Blame rained upon blame! Even today it repeats again and again. Excuses does not absolve faults. Rather, what helps is humbly accepting one's fault and asking for forgiveness. To get a deeper insight into this narrative we need to first keep aside the stereotype interpretations which focus on the role of the woman in the origin of sin in the world and let us turn our attention to the two questions posed by God. God's first question "Where are you?" is more than God's inquiry about their whereabouts, it is an invitation to an inward journey. "Where are you?" is a request toward self-examination and intimacy with the Divine. The second question, "Who told you that you were naked?" is a reminder that we must be very careful about whose voice we listen to. It is a question about the complex task of discerning right from wrong, an ongoing process in human existence. Contained within this narrative is also the promise of a Redeemer (Gen 3: 15). It's an insight into the divine plan of salvation, portraying Christ's victory over evil as fulfilling this ancient prophecy. Sin not only fractured the relationship between God and humans, but it also breached the relationship between humans themselves. Sin destroys relationships. Sin makes us suspicious and bitter and turns us against even those who love us.

In the Gospel today Jesus speaking about who are His real family. That those who do God's will are his family. The Jews over the centaury believed that because they were of the lineage of Abraham, they would automatically enter the kingdom of God (Matthew 3:7–9). Jesus' reply emphasises the point that family relationships were not a free ticket into the kingdom of God. He is not undermining the importance of family relationships; rather, He is emphasizing that having a right relationship with God by obeying His will is the most important. Every true disciple of Christ is, His brother, sister, mother and a member of his victorious family. Christ did not disrespect his own faithful mother. Rather, he teaches an important lesson today. That, through faith and obedience to God's will, we all can become members of his victorious and happy family. To become part of the victorious family of Christ is a dynamic process. It flows from a personal encounter with Christ.
