CAR PARK DEVELOPMENT

Finally, twelve years after Planning Permission was granted, most of the car park at the back of the church is being sold for housing. The building work is likely to start in the autumn. Once the houses are built there will only be 66 spaces for the use of parishioners and hall users. But, during the build, this number will be reduced, inevitably leading to issues. When further details are available, including how the issues will be managed, these will be communicated.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Acts 12:1-11;

Psalm 33;
2 Timothy 4:6-8;

Matthew 16:13-19

The first reading taken from the book of Job presents before us a very puzzling narrative – dialogue between Job and God. Job as we know was an upright and pious person, who loses everything as Satan tries to prove that Job's piety has ulterior motives. In his lament, Job questions both the order of the cosmos and the existence of divine justice because he did not deserve any of the tragedies he faced. The LORD responds by questioning Job's knowledge of God's mysteries and purposes. Though we find God being described as "a divine architect of the cosmos" in ancient literature, in the book of Job, Yahweh is portrayed as a midwife, helping the sea to be born, quickly making clothes for it out of the clouds and swaddling it in the deep, beautiful colours of the night sky. While this image conveys that God has power over natural elements it also has a deeper significance.

In ancient Near Eastern literature, the sea was often pictured as a chaotic monster who threatened the stability and order of the cosmos. Therefore, the sea was something to be afraid of, something that caused chaos in life. However, Yahweh, instead of destroying the source of chaos is giving birth to it and nurturing it. Now why would God do that? Well, there is no easy way to answer this question. As a wise person once said, when we look at the food chain, one animal consumes another, from the smallest of cells to the largest of creatures. There is disorder, destruction, killing – there is chaos. Yet, it is this same chaos that is also what keeps order. So, in a way, chaos exists as a part of God's creation, not forgetting to acknowledge that there is some serious chaos in the world today that was not part of God's creation, but man made. The seeming unpredictability of life is not evil, nor is it proof of God's failures. Rather, it points to the fact that life demands change and change demands chaos. So, while God does not directly answer Job's questions, He helps him gain a new perspective in which his grief is not the ultimate reality. God's revelation to Job and us is that the universe is far bigger, stranger, and more mysterious than we can imagine and there is a big gap between divine and human knowledge. Therefore, a relationship of trust with God is more important than answers to our question of "Why?" Job's deeper need was to know that God had not abandoned him, and that God still cared for him.

In the Gospel of Mark, we see Jesus calming the storm which highlights Jesus' divine authority over the powers of nature and serves as a beautiful example of His power to bring peace also into the storms of our lives. What practical lessons can we draw from these readings of today? 1. Trust in God's Sovereignty: Just as God sets boundaries for the sea; He also sets boundaries for the challenges and difficulties we face. When we encounter personal storms—whether they are financial struggles, health issues, or relationship conflicts—we can find comfort in the knowledge that God is and has the ultimate authority over everything. 2. Live for Christ: Paul urges us to live for Christ because of Jesus' love for each of us, calls us to a higher purpose. In our daily lives, this means making decisions that reflect our commitment to Jesus. When we live with Christ at the centre, we transform not only our own lives but also the lives of those around us. 3. Find Peace in Jesus: Just as the disciples found peace when Jesus calmed the storm, we too can find peace in Jesus Christ. When anxieties, worries and fear overtake us, if we turn to Jesus in prayer, He can bring us the peace we need. His presence among us in the Eucharist reassures us that we are not alone in our struggles and that His peace is always available to us.
