#### **NEW LECTIONARY**

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, to reflect current biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. All through the year a set of 4 volumes is used. The total cost will be £960 including book of the Gospel. Thank you to all who have sponsored the Lectionary for the Church. The standard edition of the new Sunday missal for the people's use can be ordered. Hard back missals cost £19.95 but there is 10% reduction for preorders.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings 1 Kings 19:4-8; Psalm 33; Ephesians 4:30-5:2; John 6:41-51 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

My sisters and brothers in Christ, the readings today reflect on the importance of physical and spiritual bread in our lives. In the first reading from Exodus we see the people of Israel murmuring against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness, in fact complaining against God, accusing Him of bringing the whole community into the wilderness for annihilation by hunger, not liberation. God responds to their cry and provides quail and manna for them. However, God wanted to see if the people would obey His instruction or not. Thus, He commanded the people to gather only as much as they needed each day without taking any for the next day. The people, however, did not obey and gathered more than they required. There are a couple of lessons we learn from this narrative. Firstly, the gift of manna was a test of faith. God could have provided it once and for all, giving the Israelites everything they needed in the wildness, but He didn't, He gave them only enough for the day. Every demand God makes of us is a test of faith. Faith is not a once-in-a-lifetime occurrence; it is a daily thing. Secondly, it is natural and easy to grumble and complain. Just like the Israelites we too react in the same way when faced with problems in life. Although God has never promised to remove obstacles from our path, He has promised to be with us through whatever we encounter in life.

In the second reading St. Paul emphasises that, because of our higher calling, Christians should live in a different way to the world around us. The life of the Gentiles was characterised by the 'futility of their minds' – because they were alienated from the life of God. Not only were they in a foolish denial of God, but they also harboured moral failures like licentiousness, uncleanliness, and greediness. A prisoner was released, but still wore his prison clothes and acted like a prisoner, instead of a free man. The first thing we'd say to that person is that he should put on some new clothes. Fundamentally, Paul says that for Christians, there must be a break with the past. Jesus isn't merely added to our old life; the old life dies every day, and He becomes our new life. The person is created according to the image of Jesus Christ and instinctively becomes righteous and holy in contrast to the old man, who is the person inherited from Adam and who instinctively rebels against God.

The Gospel today focuses on the Eucharist. The opening ceremony of the 2024 Paris Olympics has caused fury among Christians worldwide because of the depiction of the Last Supper. The Last Supper marks the institution of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. This is what Jesus tries to explain in today's Gospel - the importance of his body and blood. People are looking for Jesus and want to follow Him. What they want is not so much what Jesus is saying, but what Jesus can give them in this life. Jesus reminds them that although He can give them bread in this life, what they really should want is the bread of eternal life. Are we the same? Do we just want our desires to be fulfilled? Do we not want to believe in the Eucharist, Jesus the bread of life, who can provide much more than what we desire - eternal life? Can we avoid being influenced by the modern world and commit ourselves to the Eucharist. The Church celebrates today, the Feast of St. John Vianney, the patron saint of all priests. His own personal witness of holiness, faith and love for his people was the magnet that drew people, of all walks of life, not to him, but to the Lord's Presence in the Eucharist. He knew that he had to personally witness to this outpouring of God's love and mercy for His people at Mass. Please do pray for all priests especially those serving you, that we will be totally committed to the Eucharist by preparing ourselves worthily and, like John Vianney, be a witness of God's love and mercy.
