Next Sunday's Mass Readings Daniel 12:1-3; Psalm 15; Hebrews 10:11-14.18; Mark 13:24-32 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

The readings of today speak of people who reveal a profound trust and self-sacrifice, urging us to consider what we, too, might be called to give in our relationship with God. In the First Reading, we meet the widow of Zarephath. She is gathering sticks during a drought and famine to prepare the final meal for herself and her son before they die of hunger. When Elijah asks her for food, her reply reveals the depth of her poverty: she has only "a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug" (1 Kings 17:12). Yet Elijah encourages her to trust God, promising that her jar of flour and jug of oil will not run out until the rain returns. She gives her last meal and, in doing so, God sustains her and her son throughout the drought. This story teaches us the power of surrender and trust in God. In our lives we may face situations where we feel stretched to our limits, wondering if we have enough to get through our own "droughts." But this passage reassures us that God sees our needs and that, when we step out in faith, He provides.

As St. Paul writes in Philippians 4:19, "My God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." Just as the widow trusted Elijah's words, we are invited to trust that God will not abandon us, no matter how desperate our situation may seem. St. Paul encourages us in the second reading (Romans 12:1), "Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship". Just as Jesus gave Himself for us, we are called to live lives of self-giving love in response.

In the Gospel Jesus contrasts the extravagance of the scribes with the humble offering of a poor widow. Her story shows us that God values the heart behind our giving. As I reflected over this passage, I was deeply moved by this image of the widow giving her only source of sustenance to God. I couldn't really understand; how could she do that? This made me reflect on our relationship with God. Just as we have a give and take relationship with a shopkeeper - I give money and the shopkeeper gives me a product, we quite often treat God as a shopkeeper, don't we? I'll say these prayers and He should grant me my wishes, or I will make this donation and God should answer this prayer of mine. I asked myself what does God really want? He doesn't want anything. He just wants you. We all do struggle in our lives - financial difficulties, emotional strains, strains in relationships challenges and suffering are in abundance. Amidst all this, God doesn't want our possessions. He just wants our hearts. Like the widow of Zarephath, let's trust that God will provide for us, even when resources seem scarce. If there is an area where we feel anxious about our needs, lift it up to God, asking Him to take care of it and supply what is necessary. Offer our Life in gratitude. Try to find a way to give back to God this week-through prayer, service or acts of kindness. Let this be a response to the love and forgiveness we have received from Him. Give with a humble heart. The widow's gift in the temple shows us that God values even the smallest offering given with sincerity. Consider a small act of generosity you can do for someone in need, whether it's giving time, resources or even just encouragement. Remember, it's not the size of the gift but the love with which it is given that matters most. God bless you all.
