Next Sunday's Mass Readings Baruch 5:1-9; Psalm 125; Philippians 1:3-6,8-11 ; Luke 3:1-6 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today we begin a new liturgical year as we celebrating the First Sunday of Advent and also the beginning of the Jubilee Year as the Holy Father announced 2025 as the Jubilee Year. The word Advent comes from the Latin word ADVENTUS which means COMING OR ARRIVAL. In the book of Isaiah we read, "In days to come, the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest mountain". Isaiah was from Jerusalem, from Judea. He knew very well that city on the top of Mount Zion. The place literally, the dwelling place of God on earth. "In days to come" that means at the culmination of all things this will be the highest mountain. Now, Isaiah means it here spiritually. At the fulfilment of all time the praise of God will be the supreme value.

The gospel taken from Luke invites us to prepare the way for the Lord, for Jesus to be born in our hearts. In fact, all the three readings of today invite us to be waiting and vigilant. Luke tells us that Jesus is coming in a cloud with power and great glory and therefore we need to straighten up and raise our heads, watching and waiting. This is an apocalyptic language that speaks of the end of time. What does it signify? Everything that is in the world will end one day, there is nothing permanent in this world; what remains is God alone and our relationship with God. Jesus does not intend to scare us but rather to help us realize that this world is passing and there is going to be a new world; a new Heaven and a new Earth which is called the spiritual world and our spiritual relationship with God.

The message of Advent is an invitation and it is also a challenge to us. We are called to be looking forward, to be ready, to be prepared and we are asked to wait in joyful hope. Waiting is not something that we are usually good at these days. Our modern world tells us to move faster in so many ways. We have smart phones, emails and microwave ovens that all 'help' us to get through our busy days. However, Advent asks each of us to do the very opposite. During these 24 sacred days of preparation we are being asked to take some time to be still and silent, as we prepare ourselves deeply for Christmas. While we can't simply ignore the daily twists and turns over the next few weeks, neither can we ignore the words and message of Jesus in today's gospel; 'Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come... what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!" So my dear friends, as we begin our preparation in this Advent season, we ask God for His strength and grace to fight and overcome the challenges of life. Life, as we all know, throws new challenges and hardships every day. Therefore, we need to wait and count on the Lord. Our waiting should not be passive or drowsy, but rather we should stand firm and raise our heads, being passionate. Let not this new season of Advent just be a ritualistic vigilant and affair but rather a realistic affair. Let us have a family and community preparation, journeying together in the true spirit of Advent. As we prepare for the coming of the Lord, what is of highest value for us? What is the highest mountain? During these four weeks before Christmas let us keep that image of Isaiah's Mountain in our mind. Where do you worship? What is of highest value to you? I wish you a blessed Advent.
