Next Sunday's Mass Readings

1 Kings 17:10-16;
Psalm 145;
Hebrews 9:24-28;
Mark 12:38-44

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today in the Gospel we see a lawyer approach Jesus and ask a question, "teacher which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus immediately answers, without hesitation as was his normal attitude, that, "The Lord our God is one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength and then love your neighbour as you love yourself". This affirmation of Jesus concludes that God is above all and Almighty. This is 'The Truth' that we all must confess and must accept and adore Him with our whole being. Because He has created this immense universe.

Throughout human history people have debated and discussed repeatedly this great truth about the immensity of God, the only ultimate answer to all man's quest. But very often the modern rationalists interpret God in a very distorted way. When they use the word God there are a lot of conversations today between theists and atheists - and they both use the word God. Like Christopher Hitchens and Richard Dawkins, who are seriously engaging with St. Thomas Aquinas's idea of God. But in fact, they have no idea what Thomas Aguinas really means when he uses the word God. For them, God is some reality in the world, or alongside the world, or above the world; a supreme instance in the category of all kinds of beings. All the new atheists believe they are looking for a 'thing' - so let's go and find Him. But that's exactly what God is not, according to Thomas Aquinas. Thomas couldn't be clearer: he says that God is not in any genus, even that most generic of genre. God's not a thing, or an individual, or an item within nature within the world, like the ancient gods of the Greeks and the Romans, who were like superhumans with super skills and power, who exist as dimensions within nature: on the mountain tops and deep in the ocean. But God is beyond all that; He is that great ocean of existence, from which the world in its entirety comes. That is why we can say that modern science has indeed proved the non-existence of these 'gods'. With great scientific spirit we've explored the heavens, and mountaintops and the depths of the ocean and indeed we haven't found 'gods' there. Based on that, science has indeed eliminated the gods.

But the important point we want to underscore is that science in principle cannot eliminate God because God is not an item within the natural world. God is not some event or phenomenon that can be examined by the physical sciences, He's not the subject or object of an experiment, even in principle. Therefore, God is the non-conditioned and non-contingent ground of contingency. Put in religious language, that's the creator of the heavens and the earth, all that is seen and unseen. That's why the first and the most important commandment, is to love God above all. The outcome of this love is expressed in loving other human beings, because a human person is the reflection of God, His image and likeness (Genesis 1:26-27), the love we have already experienced from God in our life, the love that is poured out here in this church when we are together, the love that God already showed for this world on the cross. This same love, that we are called to experience and share in this Eucharist today.
