Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11; Psalm 104(103); Titus 2:11-14, 3:4-7; Luke 3:15-16,21-22 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

My dear friends today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek epiphaneia ($\dot{\epsilon}\pi\iota\dot{\phi}\dot{\alpha}\nu\epsilon\iota\alpha$) which means "to manifest," "appear," or "make known." According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church – "The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world" (CCC 528). The traditional belief that there were three Magi: Casper, Balthazar, and Melchior, is based on the fact that three gifts are mentioned in Matthew's Gospel: gold, frankincense and myrrh. The Magi could have been Persian priests or Babylonian astronomers or even spice traders. Eventually, however, they were pictured as representatives of different peoples and races. The Magi brought the Christ Child gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold symbolised kingship. Frankincense, used in worship to symbolise prayers rising to heaven, symbolises Jesus' divinity and myrrh, often used in burial, honours Jesus who came to give His life as a sacrifice for many.

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord invites us to renew our commitment to seek, adore, and follow Him more closely. This feast celebrates the profound revelation of Christ to the world, not just to a select few but to all nations. It was necessary for God to start the history of salvation with His chosen people - the people of Israel. Then, gradually unfold His revelation over the centuries through various people and in the fullness of time He reveals Himself to the whole of humanity through His Incarnation. The Magi who come from the East, seeking the newborn King of the Jews, though not part of the Jewish faith, willingly travel a great distance, just to honour and pay homage to the Christ child. Despite the uncertainties and risks, guided by a special star, they journey to Bethlehem. The journey of the Magi is a model for our spiritual pilgrimage. In our journey of faith, we are sure to encounter uncertainties, challenges and dark moments. How do we face them? Do we give up or do we perseveringly continue our journey, trusting in the promises of God? The Magi had to leave their comfort zones, step into the unknown, and face uncertainties for the sake of the truth they sought. Are we willing to do the same?

In the first reading from Isaiah (60:1-6), we hear the call of the prophet, "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you." Isaiah paints a picture of a future where nations are drawn to the light of God, where the abundance of His gifts flow to those who seek Him. This prophetic vision finds its fulfillment in the coming of the Magi, seeking for the child. This vision continues to find its fulfillment in our own persevering search for Christ. The Magi, upon finding Jesus, adore him by offering their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. How do we respond to Christ's presence in our lives? Do we recognise Him as the King, the Saviour, and the Light of the world? And do we, like the Magi, offer our best and acknowledge His rightful place in our lives. Further, it is not merely enough to seek Christ and pay Him our homage. We need to follow Him closely. After worshipping Christ, the Magi went back on a different route, that symbolises a life that has changed after encountering Jesus the Saviour. The question before us today is how we are responding to the epiphany of Christ in our lives. The Church invites us today to embrace our role in spreading the light of Christ, just as the Magi did so long ago. Fr. George Mathew SCJ
