Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Nehemiah 8:2-6; Psalm 19(18); 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 ; Luke 1:1-4,4:14-21 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ. The readings for today focus on the abundant love of God who transforms our lives and calls us to be joyful witnesses of his glory. The first reading from the prophet Isaiah is a beautiful poem that depicts the glory of the people of Israel. The prophet marks that Israel shall be a crown of beauty and royal diadem in the hand of the Lord. God promises to transform Zion into a place of joy and celebration indicating a deep relationship between God and His people, Israel. The prophet uses the metaphor of marriage to convey the message. Though Jerusalem had been devastated by the Babylonian conquest, the prophet envisioned Jerusalem's future glory to encourage and sustain the people. The prophet invites people to rejoice at the abundance of blessings that would be theirs once cleansed of her sins or wrongdoings.

In the second reading, from the First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians, 12: 4-11, Paul focuses on spiritual gifts and their role in building up the body of Christ, the church. He aims to correct misunderstandings among the Corinthians that prioritizing certain gifts like speaking in tongues over others can lead to pride and division in the community. He highlights the variety of gifts given by the Holy Spirit, and he says that this gifts are not for our personal glorification but for the common good, fostering unity within the body of Christ, the Church. Paul also reminds us the distribution of gifts is not based on human merits or aspirations but pure gift of God.

Today's gospel passage is taken from Gospel of St John 2: 1-11, which recounts Jesus's first miracle or sign, turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana. Cana is a small village in Galilee, which emphasizes Jesus's ministry among ordinary people. St John's Gospel is structured around seven signs that reveal Jesus's divine identity and His mission. The first sign, changing water into wine, sets the tone for Jesus's mission, that is the transformative power of Jesus. Historically, wedding celebrations in Jewish culture were significant social and religious events. Wedding feasts often for several days. Running out of wine would have been a major embarrassment for the host, symbolizing a failure to provide for guests. Wine as in Jewish tradition has a significant role as Psalm 104:15, "wine to gladden their hearts...."; wine is a symbol of joy and blessing. Mary demonstrates faith in Jesus and entrusts the situation to Him despite his initial response. This act reflects the model of discipleship. This also has a significant part of our understanding of Mary as the great mediator. She brings each of us closer to Christ by bridging the gap between us and Jesus. Jesus's first public miracle happened through the intercession of Mary. We also notice that this miracle of transformation of water into wine occurs without a visible gesture or extraordinary words from Jesus, unlike other miracles in the Gospels. The servants did whatever He told them (cf. John 2:5). And here's the amazing thing: all He asked them to do was fill those jars with water. That's all! Then a miracle followed, because of the servants' obedience. Sometimes I think we are not doing enough to live out our faith. Maybe, just like the servants at Cana, Jesus is asking us to do something simple, and well within our abilities, training and current life situation. These commands, doing whatever He tells us, may not be as complicated as we think. Easy? Not always. If we humble ourselves, no matter how insignificant it may seem, the miraculous transformation will happen in our lives. Let us allow Jesus to transform our lives. Amen.
