COMMUNITY PLANTING PROJECT AT ST. JOSEPH'S IN ASSOCITION WITH WORCETSERSHIRE WILDLIFE TRUST-SATURDAY 8TH MARCH

At St Joseph's, we are working with Worcestershire County Council and Worcestershire Wildlife Trust to be part of a big research project to see if the 'Miyawaki' method of tree planting is a good way of growing small areas of woodland in urban areas. The Miyawaki method (Tiny Forest) involves densely planting a wide selection of native tree and shrub species suited to the site into aerated, enriched soil, mulching and then maintaining the plot for two to three years, from which point minimal interventions should be made. At school we are going to have two Tiny Forest plots - one will be the traditional method control plot and one will be our experimental plot. This will have one variable to see how the trees benefit from very dense planting. Children will be monitoring the growth of these trees for years to come as the forest grows and develops just like our pupils. We would like to invite any parishioners to plant a tree on the morning of Saturday 8th March 2025. This will be a drop-in session from 10am until 1pm.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7;

Psalm 92(91);

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Dear Brothers and sisters, as we gather on this 7th Sunday of Ordinary Time, in this Jubilee Year, a time for Pilgrims of Hope, we are reminded of the enduring power of hope, even amidst challenging times. The readings of today challenge us with a radical call to love, a love that transcends our natural inclinations and mirrors the boundless mercy of God. This boundless mercy promises us hope which goes beyond all human conditions and limitations because God's mercy is unconditional and unlimited. The Gospel of today from Luke presents us not with comfortable and pleasant words, but with challenging directives: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." These words are not easy to hear and put into practice. They cut against the grain of our human nature, which often seeks self-preservation and reciprocation. We live in a world that often operates on the principle of "an eye for an eye," a world where hurt begets hurt, and where resentment becomes worse. Jesus, however, presents us with a different path, a path that breaks the cycle of violence and hate. He calls us to a love that is not conditional, not based on merit, but rather a love that flows from the very heart of

As pilgrims on this journey of hope we are called to embody this love. Think about the implications of Jesus's words. He doesn't just ask us to tolerate those who wrong us, He asks us to love them. He doesn't just ask us to refrain from retaliation, He asks us to actively do good to them. He asks us to bless those who curse us, to pray for those who mistreat us. This isn't a sentimental, weak kind of love. This is a powerful, transformative love that has the potential to change hearts and break down barriers. It is a love that fuels our pilgrimage of hope; that hope which leads us to holiness. This love is not possible through human effort alone. It is a gift, a grace that we receive from God. It requires us to surrender our own will, our own desire for revenge, and to open our hearts to the transformative power of divine love. It urges us to look at the world, and at those who hurt us, through the eyes of Christ. Like true pilgrims, we must rely on God's grace to guide us. Jesus, in his own life, perfectly embodied this radical love. He loved those who betrayed, denied and crucified Him. He showed us the face of a compassionate Father who loves unconditionally and desires mercy not sacrifice. He drew this image of a loving Father in the hearts of humanity, and now He calls us to do the same. He calls us to be pilgrims of love, an icon of Christ and reflections of His compassionate heart in the world. This means not just loving those who are easy to love, but also those who are difficult, those who challenge us, those who even hurt us. It means extending mercy as God extends mercy. It means forgiving as God forgives. This is the path of the pilgrim of hope.

Today let us reflect on these challenging words of Jesus. Let us ask ourselves: Who are the "enemies" in our lives? Who are the people who are difficult to love? How can we, through God's grace, extend love and mercy to them? Let us not be afraid to embrace the radical demands of Jesus's love. Let us not be afraid to become icons of His compassion in the world. For it is in loving as He loved that we truly become children of God, and it is in extending mercy as He extended mercy that we truly reflect the heart of our Father in heaven. As we journey on this pilgrimage of hope, may love be our compass and mercy our guide. Amen.
