Next Sunday's Mass Readings Isaiah 50:4-7; Psalm 22(21) Philippians 2:6-11; Luke 22:14-23:56 Today as we celebrate the fifth Sunday of Lent, we draw close to our destination and the most important moments in our journey this season. This fact is reflected in all the readings of this Sunday. The first reading of this Sunday is an assurance of God's continuous presence with us. It also reminds us of the new thing that God is about to do in our midst: "I will make a new covenant and never call their sin to mind...then, I will be their God, and they will be my people." God is ready to set aside a relationship that was destroyed by infidelity. He wishes to restore a broken relationship.

In the Gospel of John, we encounter the powerful narrative of the woman caught in adultery. This event is not only humiliating but also deeply inhuman and unjust. She is publicly humiliated, yet the man involved in the act is conspicuously absent. The Pharisees and Scribes are not genuinely interested in upholding the law; rather, they are using this woman as a hostage to test Jesus, hoping to trap Him in an act of blasphemy. Jewish law mandates that both the adulterer and the adulteress be put to death. However, in this situation, only the woman is accused. Jesus, however, responds with a brilliant and unexpected move. Instead of engaging in their trap, He bends down and doodles in the dust. Whatever he was writing, His response shifts the focus from the accused to the accusers. When pressed for an answer, he says, "let the one without sin cast the first stone"! And one by one, they slink away. Jesus is left alone with the woman. He looks up to her, has no one condemned you? No, no one sir! The woman replied. Neither do I condemn you, says Jesus gently, go away and sin no more. With this statement, He exposes their hypocrisy. Jesus treats her with respect. He is understanding and merciful. He invites her to turn over a new leaf in her life, that was an invitation for her to a conversion of heart. She is given a second chance. This passage highlights the mercy of God, which does not serve as an excuse to sin but as an invitation to transformation. Jesus, the only one without sin and the only one truly qualified to condemn, chooses instead to forgive. He tells the woman, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and sin no more."

This is the heart of Christianity: justice and mercy meet in Jesus Christ. By respecting the dignity of the sinner and forgiving her, He is not trying to sweep the sin under the carpet, but He provides an opportunity for redemption. His forgiveness does not mean that sin is inconsequential - on the contrary, He can forgive because He will take the punishment upon Himself. From the woman's perspective, she was caught in a conspiracy where death seemed certain. She had no hope, but Jesus gave her hope and life. In many ways, sometimes we can be like the Pharisees - quick to judge others while ignoring our own faults. Yet, we have also been in moments where we felt trapped, without hope, in need of rescue. God's presence brings hope and life, even in our darkest moments. Each of us has our ups and downs. Jesus tells us, "Go, and sin no more." The time to change is not tomorrow, not later - it is now. In Lent, we examine our conscience, recognise our vulnerability and we confess our sin. And then we are blown over by mercy! We encounter the Lord who loves us and who is waiting to forgive and to heal, to set a new heart in us. That is the overwhelming message of Lent. Not that we toughen up by our own works of penance. But that we are embraced unconditionally in the arms of God's mercy.
